

A word from Judi....

Sunday 30 September was Social Justice Sunday but what does that mean to us as a congregation and as individuals? We are familiar with images of desperate poverty from other countries but do we know about the faces of Australian poverty and do we know what poverty is? It is usually defined as a lack of financial resources but really it is marginalization. Many things in our society today 'marginalize' people and limit their opportunities to participate in normal life. Many want to fit into something but can't. They may be Indigenous persons, newly arrived refugees, people with drug and alcohol addictions or people with mental illnesses.

Jesus demonstrated many ways to live in solidarity with those who are vulnerable - sharing meals, making friends, challenging attitudes and structures that breed and perpetuate poverty. Scripture reveals Jesus restoring broken and marginalized people back to a sense of dignity and place within society.

The rich young man in the Bible who wanted to inherit eternal life was told by Jesus to "sell all he had and give to the poor - then he would have treasure in heaven." Many people do not understand the heart of love behind this verse. Does God want to make us sell everything we have and give the proceeds to the poor in order to serve Him? He would only ask us to do that if what we had was standing in the way of our being obedient to God. The point of this parable is that we should LOVE JESUS FIRST. We must love Him more than we love our "stuff" which was not the case with the rich young man. If you really want a deeper walk with God, you may have to sacrifice some things that are keeping you from it.

I see within this congregation and others who volunteer a passion to see people included, accepted, loved and brought back to life. I see the love of Jesus revealed – a love we have been equipped with to be God's hands and hearts in this mission of love and grace. Still we should always be asking ourselves: Is anything standing between myself and God? If so, we need to make it right today.
