

WHY DOES GO ALLOW SUFFERING?

The issues of suffering is the most frequently raised objection to the Christian faith. There is global suffering through natural disasters, community suffering through mass incidents and individual suffering through personal losses. Suffering is an acute problem for the Christian because we believe in a good and powerful God.

Suffering was not part of God's created order (Genesis 1-2). Suffering only began after man rebelled against God. God could have stopped the sin, but He loves us and wanted to give us free will. Love is not love if it is forced—it can only be true love if there is a choice. Suffering continues because of the disobedience of men and women.

Suffering is never good in itself but God uses it for good, it draws us to Jesus. People often share that it was only through their fear and pain that they came to Christ. We also mature as Christians as we experience trials, God prunes us to be more fruitful. God uses suffering to bring about good purposes even though, at the time it is hard to see it clearly.

We abused our God given freedom yet God used that to give His Son, Jesus to pay for our sins, once and for all. The cross is ultimately a victory because it holds the key to salvation. And this leads to eternal life where there will be no more suffering. Even though the world seems a tangled web GOD IS LOVE.

And we celebrate this love, at this time of year—CHRISTMAS, when we rejoice in the gift of God's Son JESUS CHRIST.
