

A word from Judí...

Have you noticed all the 'fad diets' that the media keep bombarding us with – diets that guarantee we will lose weight and be slim and terrific forever!

Jesus often used food as an appropriate metaphor for His mission. If you read the story of Jesus and the Samaritan Woman (*John 4:27-42*) the disciples had been shopping for food and urged Jesus to eat something.

But Jesus replied "I have food to eat that you know nothing about."

Confused the disciples looked around for another parcel of food that someone may have provided for Jesus. Jesus explained His diet which was to do God's will and finish His work. Jesus' work was to 'harvest' people for God's kingdom.

But the diet of the disciples prevented them from seeing the souls that could be harvested from the Samaritan people. Jesus knew that if the disciples could penetrate the ethnic and religious barriers they would see all people as prospective followers of Jesus.

In other words the priority diet of Jesus was and still is people, no-one is to be excluded. When we adopt Jesus' priority diet it determines our interests, how we use our time and money and how we serve.

This is the one and only GUARANTEED diet – we shed fat and run with singleness of purpose to do God's will.

Asylum Seeker Employment Opportunities

Presently there are a large number of asylum seekers being released from detention centres around Australia into the community.

At Urban Neighbours of Hope, we are regularly in contact with people in this situation. Right now the Church in Australia has a great opportunity to respond to the most vulnerable in our midst. One of the greatest needs for this group of people is employment - they have work rights, and a great willingness to work. However, work is extremely difficult to find.
