It is almost as though an image of a parent can live within us and every know and then pops its head up. The more I journey along in faith the more I realise it can be the same with God, God thoughts, kingdom attitudes, can just pop up unexpectedly, God becomes part of our DNA (of course other, not so good stuff is there too that pops out!) I've noticed that I don't have to be in prayer, or thinking about God, to be influenced by the spirit, or surprised by joy, or suddenly aware of God's presence. Perhaps that is one reason we have spiritual disciples, so that kingdom attitudes become embedded within us.

What spiritual discipline or practice works for you, and has helped you become who you are.
