Chelsea Community Church of Christ History

The Explorer Boys Club was up and running by 1964 with a total of 16 teachers and 130 Boys. The club was run by Superintendant Mr. K. Holt.

The Girls ' Good Companions Club was also running with a total of 40 girls and 3 leaders, being P. Sandercock and J. Pascoe. Along with the Junior groups there were a number of other groups being run within the Church: the Christian Women 's Fellowship, the Tennis Club and CYF.

The Church of Christ continues to rejoice in the movement towards Christianity Unity.

Chelsea Community Church of Christ History



The first public meeting was held at Beachway Hall, The Strand on March 9th 1924. The Tent Mission was ministered by P.R.Baker and Les Brooker where the first

business meeting was held. By July 1924, the first minister for the Church was appointed: Wilkie Thompson and assisted by A.W. Ladbrook. On September 20th 1925 the Chapel was opened and built for a total of £3,000.

By 3rd May 1964, there were a total of 104 members. The average number of the breaking of the bread was 71. Over the years the member numbers dwindled and we are down to an average of 16.

A Church of Christ will commence at Chelsea in the Beachway Hall, on 9th March 1924. Worship and Communion at 11.15am Gospel Service at 7.00pm

Chelsea also started their first mission in 1924 and was supported by Mr Campbell Edwards who gave the first financial token of £25. The Church Hall was completed by in July 1960 at a cost of £3,882 being from Properties Corporation.
