GOD GIVES US A LIFE BEYOND AMAZING.

I recall witnessing a Mountain Ash come crashing to the ground when I worked in the Dandenong Ranges. Towering some 100 metres above the ground and living for up to 500 years, this majestic tree had been teetering until it could stand up now longer. Her core was gone because her insides had been slowly eaten away by termites and natural mulch working its way down her centre to leave a tunnel like hole. She had been lashed by wind and water but had held her own in bush fire – but this day – her life was over. Many of us feel that we are also teetering, not knowing when the next storm will come. We can feel hollow inside, just like the tree and our core is no longer strong.
